**TETON VALLEY FOUNDATION ANNOUNCES SUBDUDES WILL HEADLINE
FINAL CONCERT OF THE SEASON**

The Teton Valley Foundation is pleased to announce the subdues will headline the final Music on Main concert on August 31st. Thursday Music on Main, a weekly concert series in Downtown Driggs, is free to the public and features prominent headliners performing from 6-9 pm every Thursday in July and August.

The subdues band was born in New Orleans and is known for an original sound – strong vocal harmonies and tight musicianship, calling upon blues, folk, R&B, country, Cajun, funk, gospel and rock'n'roll influences. This funky boogie music is guaranteed to get the audience on its feet. Folk/blues singer and Jackson resident Margo Valiante will open the show.

Concerts take place in the new Main Street Park in downtown Driggs at the corner of Bates and Main. Concertgoers are encouraged to bring their own chairs and blankets. Families are encouraged to attend but, regrettably, we ask that you leave your dogs at home. Vendors will be on site to provide food and drinks. Concerts will be held outdoors, rain or shine, provided the weather is safe for the musicians and equipment.

The mission of the newly formed Teton Valley Foundation is to organize and implement performances, attractions and events for the education and benefit of the Teton Valley community. The Foundation's primary activity is to host several world-class, multi-day events each year intended to promote the unique nature of the Valley and increase economic activity in the community. Events will include athletics, the arts, culture and education.
