**AUGUST CONCERTS INCLUDE JERRY JOSEPH, GRAND TARGHEE
MOUNTAIN BOYS & THE BLIND BOYS OF ALABAMA**

The Teton Valley Foundation is pleased to announce the lineup for the first three Thursdays in August. Thursday Music on Main, a weekly concert series in Downtown Driggs, is free to the public and features prominent headliners performing from 6-9 pm every Thursday in July and August.

Jerry Joseph and the Jackmormons have toured extensively with Widespread Panic and Gov't Mule and have their own cult following. On August 3rd, Jerry and his band will return to the Tetons with a special acoustic show sure to provide plenty of trademark rhythmic spirit and honest grit.

August 10th will bring together bluegrass musicians Matt Flinner, Time Stafford, Brian Wicklund, Eric Thorin, John Lowell & Ben Winship, instructors at Grand Targhee's first annual bluegrass camp, in their only live appearance. This show is not to be missed!

On August 17th Grammy award winners, The Blind Boys of Alabama will raise the roof with the spirit and energy of pure soul gospel music accompanied by funk-up loops and roaring blues riffs. Opening for this stellar group will be Alta, WY resident and country blues artist Michael Hurwitz with his band the Aimless Drifters.

Concerts take place in the new Main Street Park in downtown Driggs at the corner of Bates and Main. Concertgoers are encouraged to bring their own chairs and blankets. Families are encouraged to attend but, regrettably, we ask that you leave your dogs at home. Vendors will be on site to provide food and drinks. Concerts will be held outdoors, rain or shine, provided the weather is safe for the musicians and equipment.

The mission of the newly formed Teton Valley Foundation is to organize and implement performances, attractions and events for the education and benefit of the Teton Valley community. The Foundation's primary activity is to host several world-class, multi-day events each year intended to promote the unique nature of the Valley and increase economic activity in the community.
