TETON VALLEY FOUNDATION ANNOUNCES ADDITIONAL CONCERTS

The Teton Valley Foundation is pleased to announce the line up for the Thursday Music on Main July 13th and July 20th shows. Thursday Music on Main, a weekly concert series in Downtown Driggs, is free to the public and features prominent headliners performing from 6-9 pm each Thursday in July and August.

July 13th features bluegrass quintet, Kane's River, described as one of the very best modern bluegrass bands of the century. Anne & Pete Sibley will open the show with their original and traditional bluegrass harmonies. July 20th will feature Big Hole Music's Locals Showcase featuring the rocking girl trio Seriously followed by the sounds of original American bluegrass by artists Greg Creamer and Michael Batdorf. Stay tuned for announcements on the remaining line up of performers.

Concerts will take place in the new Main Street Park in downtown Driggs at the corner of Bates and Main. Concertgoers are encouraged to bring their own chairs and blankets. Families are encouraged to attend but, regrettably, we ask that you leave your dogs at home. Vendors will be on site to provide food and drinks. Concerts will be held outdoors, rain or shine, provided the weather is safe for the musicians and equipment.

The mission of the newly formed Teton Valley Foundation is to raise and distribute funds for charitable purposes through the organization and implementation of performances, attractions and events for the education and benefit of the Teton Valley community. The Foundation's primary activity is to host several world-class, multi-day events each year intended to promote the unique nature of the Valley and increase economic activity in the community.
